


Hurricane Florence headed towards western North Carolina?

Watch Out For Price Gouging Scams During Hurricane Florence

RALEIGH, NC (September 11, 2018) -- As Hurricane Florence approaches our coast this week, all of North Carolina is under a state of emergency. This means that our state's price gouging law is in effect as well. Price gouging occurs if businesses or vendors charge excessively high prices in a time of crisis. If you notice businesses in your area charging too much while under a state of emergency, report them to our office by calling 1-877-5-NO-SCAM or by filing a complaint online at http:// ncdoj.gov/pricegougingcomplaint. The price gouging law took effect when the state of emergency was declared on Friday, Sept. 7, and will remain in effect until the state of emergency is lifted.

Stay Safe and Avoid Scams

RALEIGH, NC (September 10, 2018) -- The price gouging law that protects consumers from scammers is now in effect in North Carolina after Governor Roy Cooper declared a state of emergency for the state as Hurricane Florence moves toward the coast. Attorney General Josh Stein notified businesses and consumers today to be on the lookout for any issues.

Price Gouging Law in Effect in North Carolina...

"My office is here to protect North Carolinians from scams and frauds," said Attorney General Josh Stein. "That is true all the time – but especially during severe weather. It is against the law to charge an excessive price during a state of emergency. If you see a business taking advantage of this storm, please let my office know so we can hold them accountable."

North Carolina has a strong statute against price gouging – charging too much during a time of crisis – that is tied directly to a declaration of a state of emergency. When Governor Cooper declared a state of emergency for North Carolina on Friday, September 7, the statute went into effect for the entire state and will remain so until the state of emergency is lifted.

Attorney General Stein and the North Carolina Department of Justice will be reviewing complaints from consumers closely over the next several weeks and are prepared to take action against any businesses engaging in price gouging activities. SBI's Northwestern District Office Phone Number is Being Spoofed

HICKORY, NC (September 7, 2018) -- Citizens from Rolesville to Rutherfordton are getting deceptive calls from people who are spoofing the State Bureau of Investigation's Northwestern District Office phone number and claiming to be from the SBI. These people are not with the SBI and have no connection with the agency.

Spoofing uses technology that allows an anonymous person to send and receive phone messages from a different number than the device they are using. The SBI number being spoofed is 828-294-2226.

If anyone gets a call from someone claiming to be with the SBI and saying that you are the victim of identity theft, disregard the caller and hang up. Local law enforcement, not the SBI, are the ones who handle identity theft cases.

In addition, if an SBI agent were to call, he or she would identify himself or herself and give his or her agent identification number. That number can be verified by calling the district number, 828-294-2226, or by calling SBI headquarters at 919-662-4500.

The spoof calls are being reported to local police departments as well as the Northwestern District Office in Hickory.

Blue Ridge Energy Prepares for Potential Impacts of Hurricane Florence

LENOIR, NC (September 10, 2018) -- Blue Ridge Energy is closely monitoring the path and potential impacts of Hurricane Florence as it develops, preparing to respond quickly and safely should outages occur.

Line technicians are prepping trucks with all necessary supplies and materials for any outages that may occur as a result of the storm. System operators monitor the Blue Ridge power system and weather on a daily, 24-hour basis and all other employees are on high alert, ready to respond to member needs, including the cooperative's member/customer service contact center.

While the path of the storm is evolving, all parts of North Carolina could be impacted due to the severity of the storm.

Blue Ridge Energy urges members to act now to make preparations to remain safe and comfortable in the event of an outage.

How You Can Prepare:

- Assemble an emergency kit. It should include at least a three-day supply of water, non-perishable food, medication, first aid supplies, a flashlight, weather radio and extra batteries. Include a list of emergency contacts.
- Charge your cell phone and have external, backup power sources charged.
- Develop an evacuation plan in case it's needed. Communicate the plan to your family. Include pets or livestock in your plan.
- Secure outdoor items. Safely store lawn furniture, decorations, toys, garbage cans and other items that can be brought indoors.
- Close windows and doors in the event of high winds.
- \bullet Fuel up. Fill up your vehicles before the storm as a loss of power could put affect gas stations.
- Consider having supplies handy for your propane or charcoal grill. Be sure to grill outdoors in well ventilated areas for safety.

Keep the Blue Ridge Energy outage reporting number handy: 1-800-448-2383. Members can also report outages on the Blue Ridge Energy mobile app, available for free on app stores.

As a reminder, if heavy rains and strong winds lead to downed lines, stay away! Contact with downed lines can be dangerous, even deadly. Report downed power lines to Blue Ridge Energy at 1-800-451-5474 or call 911 immediately.

Hibriten Outruns South, Wins Caldwell Cup

SAWMILLS, NC (September 7, 2018) -- I begin with the typical "duh" statement, in pro football, it is the Lombardi Trophy for the Super Bowl winner. Having seen it this at the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio recently, have to say "nice piece of hardware". In professional hockey, it is known as the Stanley Cup. In Stanly County, NC, it is also known as the "Stanly Cup" sponsored by the local newspaper there.

Here in Caldwell County, sponsored by the Lenoir News Topic, it is simply called the Caldwell Cup, presented to the high school who goes 2-0 among the high schools in Caldwell County. Since Hibriten defeated West Caldwell in the season opener and South Caldwell this past Friday, 56-12, the Topic's Sports Aficianado Bryant Lilley presented the hardware to the 2018 winner after the game.

One feature with regard to the Spartans this season; their offense is moving the football with better efficiency. They gained 340 total yards from scrimmage, topped by Quarterback Jason Martin's strikes of 77 and 48 yards to Austin Raynor along with Avery Raynor and Isaiah Kirby rushing for 44 and 45 yards respectively. The defense managed early to sack Panthers quarterback Jaylen Scott for an eleven-yard loss and hold star tailback McKinley Witherspoon to eight yards on his first five carries.

Note, there is a valid reason for Hibriten winning the NCHSAA 2AA State championship., McKinley Witherspoon. After he began with futility, he regained form at the 3:16 mark of the second period, scoring the first of his three touchdowns. Witherspoon finished the contest with 138 yards along with Marqwone Jones with 113 yards. Hibriten opened the scoring match with a 65-yard touchdown pass to Skylin? Thomas after recovering a Spartans' fumble. Fumbles have been a "bugaboo" for the Spartans at this stage of the season.

"Our offense is now a two-headed monster. We know we can move the ball in the air and on the ground. We still have a few things to work on with regard to our defense and turnovers. Hibriten is a fast and solid team and I'm proud of our guys effort tonight" commented South head coach Marc Kirkpatrick.

South continues with its non-conference schedule as they host the R-S Central Hilltoppers. It is likely that the game will be played in mid-week as most of North Carolina is bracing itself for Hurricane Florence. It is suggested that you follow the school calendar, or the Caldwell Journal as Mark will post such information with rescheduling and time of kickoff.

Caldwell County Sheriff's Office makes arrest after yearlong investigation

LENOIR, NC (September 7, 2018) -- Sheriff Alan C. Jones announces that after a yearlong investigation an arrest has been made related to an overdose death that was reported to the Caldwell County Sheriff's Office on August 3, 2017.

Dorian Roshad Ferguson, age 31, was arrested on Thursday and charged with one count of Second Degree Murder related to the Drug Overdose death of Michael Todd Hollar, age 48, that was reported on August the 3rd 2017 at 2087 Ransom Place in Lenoir, NC.

The investigation into the death of Hollar revealed that Hollar consumed a lethal amount of Fentanyl which was the cause of his death. Investigators were able to determine that the Fentanyl that was ingested by Hollar was supplied by Dorian Roshad Ferguson prior to his death.

Investigators with the Caldwell County Sheriff's Office and Lenoir Police Department are continuing to work very closely with members of the District Attorney's Office for the 25th Judicial District to combat the string of deaths related to fentanyl overdoses.


Dorian Ferguson is currently serving a prison sentence related an arrest for Possession of Fentanyl that also occurred on August 3, 2017.
