Several drug related arrests made in Lenoir

LENOIR, NC (March 15, 2019) -- On March 14th, 2019 at 9:03 pm officers from the Lenoir Police Department's Narcotics Unit and the Lenoir Police Department's Special Response Team with the assistance of the Caldwell County Sheriff's Office served a search warrant at the residence of 1301 Jolly Pl. Lenoir, NC 28645. While conducting the search of the residence investigators found and seized 2.8 grams of methamphetamine, 1 sawed off shot gun, and \$510.00 in US currency. According to North Carolina State guidelines, the seized drugs were valued at \$435.00.

Adam Daly, Brittany Greene, Carolyn Gibson, and Michael Coffey were arrested at the scene. Adam Daly was charged with 1 count of Felony Possession with Intent to Manufacture, Sell, or Deliver Methamphetamine, 1 count of Felony Maintaining a Vehicle/Dwelling for Controlled Substance, 1 count of Felony Possession of a Weapon of Mass Destruction, and 1 count of Felony Possession of a Firearm by a Felon. Daly received a \$100,000.00 secured bond and an initial court date of 03/15/2019. Brittany Greene was charged with 1 count of Felony Possession with Intent to Manufacture, Sell, or Deliver Methamphetamine. Greene received a \$20,000.00 secured bond and an initial court date of 03/15/2019. Carolyn Gibson was charged with 1 count of Felony Maintaining a Vehicle/Dwelling for Controlled Substance. Gibson received a \$10,000.00 secured bond and an initial court date of 03/15/2019. Michael Coffey was charged with 1 count of Felony Possession of Methamphetamine. Coffey received a \$15,000.00 secured bond and an initial court date of 03/15/2019.

Caldwell Journal Weekly Recipe Lemon Asparagus Chicken Pasta

Ingredients

Kosher salt 1 lb. linguine or spaghetti 1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil 1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts Freshly ground black pepper 2 tsp. Italian seasoning 2 tbsp. butter 1 small red onion, chopped 1 lb. asparagus, stalks trimmed and quartered 3/4 c. heavy cream 1/2 c. low-sodium chicken broth Juice of 1 lemon 3 cloves garlic, minced 3/4 c. shredded mozzarella 1/2 c. freshly grated Parmesan, plus more for garnish 1 lemon, sliced into half moons Freshly chopped parsley, for garnish

Instructions

In a large pot of salted boiling water, cook pasta according to package directions until al dente. Drain and return to pot.

In a skillet over medium heat, heat olive oil. Add chicken and season with salt, pepper, and Italian seasoning. Cook until golden and no longer pink, 8 minutes per side. Transfer to a plate to let rest, then thinly slice.

To skillet, melt butter over medium heat. Add red onion and asparagus and season with salt and pepper. Cook until tender, 5 minutes, then add heavy cream, chicken broth, lemon juice, and garlic and simmer 5 minutes.

Stir in cheeses and let cook until melty, then add lemon slices and cooked linguine.

Top with sliced chicken and garnish with more Parmesan and parsley.

Here's how to find out if that's the case – complete the Department of Information Technology's Broadband Speed Report. It takes only a few minutes, and you'll learn whether the internet speed you're getting matches the internet speed that your broadband service provider advertised. Completing the report also gives DIT a more complete picture of unserved and underserved areas in North Carolina.

WBTV Adds More Local Programming

CHARLOTTE, NC (March 18, 2019) -- WBTV announced today plans to launch a new hour of local programming at 3 p.m. starting on September 9, 2019. The time slot currently features "STEVE," the daytime talk show hosted by Steve Harvey finishing up its seventh and final season under a distribution deal with NBCUniversal. Instead of pursuing a new syndicated deal, WBTV is investing locally.

Once the new show launches in September, WBTV will be the largest producer of local programming in the Charlotte market, producing 52 hours of unique local broadcast television per week.

"We couldn't be more excited to bring the Charlotte marketplace more local content," said WBTV Vice President and General Manager Scott Dempsey. "We have had such a strong response from 'Morning Break' that making the decision to give the audience more of what they want was easy."

"Morning Break" is a local lifestyle talk show that airs weekday mornings at 9 a.m. on WBTV. It features a mix of editorial and sponsored content that has been such a hit with its fans that the station was overwhelmed by audience feedback during a brief experiment that reduced the show to a half-hour last September. It was back to a full hour by January.

The new local program at 3 p.m. is still taking shape but promises to offer audiences and advertising clients an exciting new option. Teams at the station are working on content development, branding and technical logistics. WBTV anchor Kristen Miranda, who also hosts "Morning Break," will host the new show alongside a cohost who will be selected later this summer. The show will incorporate elements of "Morning Break" and the station's digital lifestyle brand, "Queen City Weekend."

WBTV has a track record of successfully launching local programming to replace syndication. Most recently, "On Your Side Tonight with Jamie Boll" replaced "Access Hollywood" weeknights at 7:30 p.m and outperformed in the time slot with Adults 25-54 by 33% during February's Nielsen ratings period. Boll's show follows "WBTV News Primetime," a weeknight newscast at 7 p.m. that has been hosted by veteran anchor Maureen O'Boyle since debuting in 2006. The two shows are the only live, local news options at 7 p.m. in the Charlotte market.

Granite Falls Police Department arrests four individuals

GRANITE FALLS, NC (March 18, 2019) -- The Granite Falls Police Department served a search warrant at 72 Archer Street, Granite Falls which resulted in the arrest of four individuals.

On March 18, 2019 at approximately 3:52pm, the Granite Falls Police Department executed a search warrant in an attempt to locate Marcus Alan Rudisill, 31, of 72 Archer Street, Granite Falls.
