#### Troxler encourages horse owners to vaccinate against mosquito-borne diseases and rabies

RALEIGH, NC (April 17, 2019) -- Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler is encouraging horse owners to have their animals vaccinated against Eastern Equine Encephalomyelitis and West Nile Virus.

"April until November is prime mosquito-breeding season in North Carolina and when horses are at risk if not properly vaccinated," Troxler said. "EEE is fatal 90 percent of the time in horses and WNV has a fatality rate of 30 percent. Both diseases are preventable by vaccination."

Mosquito-borne diseases can be deadly to horses, donkeys, mules...

Last year, North Carolina saw its first case of EEE in July. There were seven recorded cases of EEE and five cases of WNV in horses in North Carolina in 2018, but the mild winter could cause that number to go up this year, State Veterinarian Doug Meckes said. Meckes recommends that equine owners talk to their veterinarians about an effective vaccination protocol to protect horses from mosquito-borne diseases. The combination vaccination initially requires multiple injections for horses, mules and donkeys that have no prior vaccination history.

Mosquitoes can breed in any puddle that lasts for more than four days, so removing any source of standing water can reduce the chance of exposing animals to WNV or EEE. Keeping horses in stalls at night, using insect screens and fans and turning off lights after dusk can also help reduce exposure to mosquitoes. Insect repellants can be effective if used according to the manufacturer's instructions.

Symptoms of EEE include impaired vision, aimless wandering, head pressing, circling, inability to swallow, irregular staggering gait, paralysis, convulsions and death. Once a horse has been bitten by an infected mosquito, it may take three to 10 days for symptoms to appear.

Symptoms of WNV include fever, weakness or paralysis of hind limbs, impaired vision, head pressing, seizures and aimless wandering.

"If your horses or other equine animals exhibit any symptoms of EEE or WNV, contact your veterinarian immediately," Meckes said.

People, horses and birds can become infected from a bite by a mosquito carrying the diseases, but there is no evidence that horses can transmit the viruses to other horses, birds or people through direct contact.

"It's also a great time to make sure your animal is current on its rabies vaccination," Troxler said. "In North Carolina we see about five cases of rabies in livestock each year. Horses are naturally curious animals, which puts them at risk for a bite if a rabid animal gets through their fence line."

#### Caldwell Journal Weekly Recipe

#### **Classic Stuffed Peppers**

#### **Ingredients**

1/2 c. uncooked rice
2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling
1 medium onion, chopped
1 tbsp. tomato paste
3 cloves garlic, minced
1 lb. ground beef
1 (14.5-oz.) can diced tomatoes
1 tsp. dried oregano
Kosher salt
Freshly ground black pepper
6 bell peppers, tops and cores removed
1 c. shredded Monterey jack

## Freshly chopped parsley, for garnish Instructions

Preheat oven to 400°. In a small saucepan, prepare rice according to package instructions. In a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Cook onion until soft, about 5 minutes. Stir in tomato paste and garlic and cook until fragrant, about 1 minute more. Add ground beef and cook, breaking up meat with a wooden spoon, until no longer pink, 6 minutes. Drain fat.

Return beef mixture to skillet, then stir in cooked rice and diced tomatoes. Season with oregano, salt, and pepper. Let simmer until liquid has reduced slightly, about 5 minutes.

Place peppers cut side-up in a 9"-x-13" baking dish and drizzle with oil. Spoon beef mixture into each pepper and top with Monterey jack, then cover baking dish with foil.

Bake until peppers are tender, about 35 minutes. Uncover and bake until cheese is bubbly, 10 minutes more. Garnish with parsley before serving.

## CONSUMER ALERT: These medical supplies may show up at your door, even if you didn't purchase them.

RALEIGH, NC (April 11, 2019) -- Our Consumer Protection Division has received complaints from people who were sent medical supplies, especially back and knee braces, that they never purchased, and then harassed by robocallers to pay for the supplies. These scammers having been operating throughout the country, and the federal government recently charged 24 individuals for scamming people out of more than \$24 million. Here's how this scam usually works and what to do if it happens to you.

Consumers will initially receive a telemarketing call that tells them their health insurance (usually Medicaid or Medicare) qualifies them to receive a free medical device. Most consumers decline this offer, but the device will be delivered to their address anyway. After consumers receive the device, scammers will either attempt to bill their health insurance for it or call the consumer multiple times asking for payment.

If this has happened to you or a loved one, don't feel pressured to pay for something that you didn't order. You don't have to, and under state law you are allowed to keep the product you didn't order without paying for it. Please report the scam to our office's Consumer Protection Division at ncdoj.gov/complaint or 1-877-5-NO-SCAM. And while robocalls are frustrating, here's more information on steps you can take to lower the number of spam calls you receive.

"The millions of people that visit us each year have a tremendous opportunity to help preserve and protect the Parkway and its resources for future generations," said Parkway Superintendent J.D. Lee. "The protection of the Parkway, in large part, is in the hands of our users and dependent upon visitors treating this place and its resources with respect."

Along with the complete schedule of facility operating dates, information to help plan a memorable and safe Parkway experience is available on the Parkway's website; including regularly updated information regarding ranger programs, tours, music performances, and cultural demonstrations.

In order to address ongoing maintenance needs along the motor route, visitors can also expect several road projects happening throughout the summer season. The Parkway website and real time road map are important planning tools that provide complete information regarding road projects or potential delays.

#### About the Blue Ridge Parkway

The 469-mile Blue Ridge Parkway connects Shenandoah

National Park to the north with Great Smoky Mountains National Park to the south. The route travels the crests, ridges, and valleys of five major mountain ranges, encompassing several geographic and vegetative zones ranging from 600 to more than 6,000 feet above sea level. It provides visitors with many varied vistas of scenic Appalachian landscapes ranging from forested ridgetops and mountain slopes to rural farm lands and urban areas. The parkway offers a "ride-a-while, stop-a-while" experience that includes scenic pullouts, recreation areas, historic sites, and visitor contact stations.
