Proceeds benefit the continuing development of the HUB Station. Concessions will be available.



Foothills Conservancy of North Carolina purchases 17-acre bog in Jonas Ridge for permanent protection and future public use

MORGANTON, NC (December 31, 2019) -- On Dec. 16, Foothills Conservancy of North Carolina closed on 17 acres of bog land in Jonas Ridge, bordering the Pisgah Loop Scenic Highway. The conservancy purchased the property from landowner Hazel Shell with funding from Clabough Foundation, North Carolina Clean Water Management Trust Fund, and a private donor.

The original owner, Lester Shell, purchased the property and divided it between his two children: Johnny, Hazel's late husband, and Sue Ann. Burke County contacted Hazel about purchasing the property for conservation and eventual public use.

"It means a lot to me to have that land protected," said Shell. "It isn't being used, and I think Jonas Ridge needs something that residents of Jonas Ridge and all people of Burke County can enjoy."



Southern Appalachian mountain bogs are rare and contain vulnerable ecosystems. At the highest elevations in Burke County, Jonas Ridge Bog is habitat to unique species of plants, animals, and insects. The bog is also home to cranberries, a species typically associated with New England, and, in North Carolina, it is a threatened species as defined by the N.C. Natural Heritage Program. The bog property drains to headwaters of Upper Creek, a high quality trout stream as designated by the N.C. Department of Environmental Quality.

There are three bogs within the state parks system in Western North Carolina: Pineola Bog, Beech Creek Bog, and Sugar Mountain Bog. Foothills Conservancy is just one group of many that are helping to protect the remaining natural bogs in the mountains.

In partnership with Burke County on the Jonas Ridge project, Foothills Conservancy intends to donate the property to the county to own and steward with a N.C. Clean Water Management Trust Fund conservation easement.

Future plans for the bog include an interpretive trail along which hikers can learn about the significance and importance of bog ecosystems.

We preserve the natural and cultural heritage of our region by conserving scenic and recreational landscapes, productive farms and forests, healthy watersheds, rich biodiversity, and vital wildlife habitat. A 501(c)(3) nonprofit, Foothills Conservancy serves eight counties: Alexander, Burke, Caldwell, Catawba, Cleveland, Lincoln, McDowell, and Rutherford, in three major river basins, which include the Broad, Catawba, and Yadkin. Museum's Educational Program Highlights Hugh Morton's Living Legacy of Grandfather Mountain

President of Grandfather Mountain Stewardship Foundation to give talk profiling Hugh Morton, prolific photographer and founder of Grandfather Mountain nature preserve...

BLOWING ROCK, North Carolina: On Thursday, January 23rd, 2020, from 11am - 12pm, Jesse Pope will lead a conversation at Blowing Rock Art & History Museum about the past, present, and future of Grandfather Mountain State Park. The talk will focus on the life and legacy of Hugh Morton, founder of Grandfather Mountain nature preserve.

Hugh Morton was born in 1921 in Wilmington, NC. As a child, Hugh frequently visited the High Country and learned photography at Camp Yonahnoka near Grandfather Mountain in Avery County. When he was only thirteen years old he published his first photograph— a golf scene that appeared in a N.C. tourism advertisement in Time Magazine. In the following years, Morton's photographs would come to be seen in countless publications throughout eight decades, in books, magazines, newspapers, and calendars, and many more. Some Morton photographs have been published many times over; others, however, have rarely or never been seen.

Blowing Rock Art & History Museum is featuring many of Morton's lesser known photographs in the current exhibition, "Photographs by Hugh Morton: An Uncommon Retrospective" that is on display until February 22, 2020.

The January 23rd "Scholars & Scones" talk at the Museum will discuss the interesting life and longtime legacy of Hugh Morton, most notably his achievements at Grandfather Mountain. The talk will be led by Jesse RadioShack.
